The Secret of Life

Singer/songwriter James Taylor wrote, "The secret of life is enjoying the passage of time." It was the Friday before Christmas when I had the opportunity to meet one of our patients who discovered that secret long before Taylor ever sang about it. Frank Lacko, Sr. turned 101 on October 1st. You can only imagine the new wonders he has witnessed during his life. There was telephone, radio and television, airline travel, computers and medical miracles like antibiotics just to name a few.

Lacko, who was raised in the coal mining town of Lansford, Pennsylvania, told me of his first great adventure. It was the 1920's and aviators were barnstorming across America. Famed pilot Amelia Earhart was making a visit to a nearby town. Just 14-years-old, Frank Lacko was determined to meet her and fly in her plane. The town she was to visit was several miles away. Frank, with only a few dollars in his pocket, walked to the airfield in Scranton. Once there he bought a hot dog to hold off his hunger. As he waited in line, he realized he no longer had enough money to cover the cost of a ride on Earhart's plane. This didn't stop Frank from negotiating with the ticket taker to amend the length of his ride to what he could afford. Hearing the hubbub, Earhart listened to Lacko make his case and told the ticket taker to make sure "the kid got a good ride"!

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Finding Light in the Darkness

Mary Lou Bender needed help and she did not know where to turn. After 41 years of marriage, her husband had taken his own life and she felt "hopeless". Her friend's husband was in Hospice, and she suggested that Mary Lou call the Hospice Grief Center. Mary Lou had no idea that she could get counseling without having a loved one who was in the program. She made the call. Joyce Nevola, LMSW, Bereavement Counselor answered and said, "We are here to help you through this. When can you come in?" Mary Lou received individual counseling and participated in a spousal support group, grief yoga, and a special program for coping through the holidays.



Participants in the spousal support group shared their darkest moments but quickly realized they were not alone in their struggles. Mary Lou said, "Gradually we gained strength and healing from each other." The group became like family and she considers these friends a "blessing that came from a terrible tragedy". After the group sessions ended they continued to meet for dinner and stay connected, continuously watching out for each other. The group has been a lifeline for Mary Lou.

As I listened to him I noticed Frank was wearing the veteran's pin that Hospice presents to honor the men and women in the armed forces. If you ask Frank about World War II, he would say that his wife was his hero for taking care of the farm and young family he left behind while he served in the Navy on the USS Midway. Lacko was one of the bakers aboard the 3000-manned aircraft carrier. Of course, this led to another great story. It seems one of Frank's shipmates turned 18 while on board and never had a birthday cake growing up. Despite the Navy prohibiting such practices, he made the cake for his friend. Lacko caught some flack for the effort, but his commanding officer thought the cake was so good that birthday cakes became standard practice on board the USS Midway.

Some years after the war, the Lackos moved to Middleburgh, NY, where they raised their family of four. Frank farmed during the day, and he operated a crane at night at the nearby General Electric foundry. In their later years, he and his wife Elizabeth loved to travel and visited historic sites in the U.S. and Canada in their motorhome. With Frank's love for history he was able to identify and donate a Native American Turtle Clan amulet that was found on land that he rented in Schoharie. This relic was the first evidence that the Turtle Clan lived in Schoharie County. Lacko was determined that the pendant be returned to its people and is very proud to have been part of that.

At Hospice we talk a lot about making the best of the time we have left. Betsy Sadlon, Frank's daughter and primary caregiver says her father "loved everything he's ever done". Frank enjoys telling his stories to his family, including 8 grandchildren and 6 great grandchildren, and friends. This time of sharing is special for both Frank and the people he loves. His life experiences, his stories and the years of hard work are a testament to a man who made obstacles into adventures.

Mary Lou reached out to me a few months ago and indicated that she wanted to include the Hospice Foundation of CNY in her will. I provided her the proper legal name, address, phone number and tax identification number to use. She contacted her bank and asset administrators to find out how to complete the appropriate paperwork. They told her she needed new beneficiary forms, which were available on-line. I thought to myself, 'How can I show my gratitude? How can I share that ray of light?'" Mary Lou said that when it was done, she felt a shift in her life for the better. After many years of hard work and saving, her life had a "sense of purpose". Mary Lou considers making a planned gift to the Hospice Foundation of CNY a privilege. We couldn't be more grateful to her for sharing her story and for her generosity and thoughtfulness.

Children and Grief


It can be very upsetting for a parent or caregiver when a child is hurting after the death of a special person who died, especially when the parent or caregiver are grieving themselves. It is important to know that children do grieve and they grieve differently from adults. It takes time for a child to fully understand and accept the person's absence. We cannot take away grief. We can only teach children how to cope with their feelings about the loss. How do you know when a child is struggling with their grief? You may see mood fluctuations, alteration in their school performance or behavior changes.



So how can you help your child? Be truthful. Do not avoid words like death and dying. Children often know more than we think, and honest conversation based upon a child's developmental age is helpful. Every child's grief is as unique as the relationship they had with the person who died. It is important for a parent or guardian to reassure the child that they are not alone; family and friends can help them. Also remember, grief knows no calendar. A child, like an adult, can experience grief over and over again. They may benefit from adult guidance and connecting with other children who have also experienced a loss.

The Hospice of CNY Grief Center will be offering a children's grief group starting on March 7th for children ages 5 through 12. You must register for this 6-week session. If you feel that your child can benefit from this group or have additional questions, please call the Grief Center at 315-634-2208.
